5. QUESTION TIME

Questions Received in Writing Prior to the Meeting

James Judd - Colac

1. What percentage is added to proposed increases or deducted from decreases in rates to allow for any shortfall as a result of objections to Council's valuations being allowed or are future rates inflated to cover any shortfall?

Response:

There is no calculated allowance to cater for objections to valuations. Should there be a reduction in income as a result of objections to valuations, Council would have to reassess the level of services provided to our community.

 If errors in budget items are made in print, how long will it take for those to be picked up and adjusted? Is it months or years and then only settle errors with those who object to charges or everyone overcharged then include in any refunds compound interest until paid at rate charged on late rate payments.

Response:

The error referred to by Mr Judd appeared in the draft budget presented to Council on 13 June 2012. The error was picked up and corrected in the budget adopted by Council on 27 June 2012.

3. If one transaction has no affect on valuations when it affects the price paid for all nearby sales, how can you claim it has no affect on total valuations for revaluations?

Response:

As previously explained to Mr Judd in a letter to him dated 19 June 2012, for the purposes of the 2012 revaluation, valuers have analysed property sales occurring in the period between August 2010 and March 2012. An analysis of sales of multiple commercial properties within Colac allows the valuers to determine what the level of value for such properties is as at the valuation date. Any abnormally low or high sales in comparison to the general value is further investigated. Other factors also considered by valuers might include: rental income, level of outgoings, age and condition of buildings, availability of carparking and type of business.

How will the new rural planning zone reforms affect agenda item OM122507-6
 Planning Scheme Amendment C69 - Consideration of Submissions?

Response:

The General Manager Sustainable Planning & Development stated that it is the intention of the recommendation that this matter be referred to an independent planning panel. This panel would consider any changes to planning zones as a matter of course. The community would also get a further opportunity to make a submission to this panel.

<u> Jeremy McCreadie – Lavers Hill</u>

1. Now that the Planning Minister has called for more flexibility in town planning, do Councillors agree with his statements?

Response:

The General Manager Sustainable Planning & Development stated that Council officers were in the process of reviewing the information from the Minister and would update Councillors at a future workshop as to how the Council and the community might benefit from the changes. Any issues which will impact on the Rural Living Strategy will be addressed through the panel stage.

2. Will there be another process in place to deal with the changes forecast by the State Government?

Response:

The General Manager Sustainable Planning & Development advised that there would not be any specific process but that the Panel established to consider submissions to the Rural Living Strategy and the Forest Structure Plan would look at any changes and make sure that the planning proposal is consistent with those changes.

3. So the changes forecast by the State Government will be considered by the Panel?

Response:

The General Manager Sustainable Planning & Development reiterated that the Panel would consider any changes to planning zones that have a material impact on the Rural Living Strategy and the Forest Structure Plan.

4. Does Council embrace having more flexibility with the farm zones?

Response:

The General Manager Sustainable Planning & Development advised that until the proposed changes have been reviewed, Council would not be in a position to make a statement. However, in principle, Council would be very supportive of having more flexibility with respect to decision making around planning zones.
