4. MAYORAL STATEMENT

Colac Otway Shire acknowledges the original custodians and law makers of this land, their elders past and present and welcomes any descendents here today.

5. QUESTION TIME

Questions Received in Writing Prior to the Meeting

Julie Smith - in relation to Amendment C69 and the Panel Hearing Report:

1. When was the most recent DWMP undertaken by Council?

Response

The most recent DWMP (Domestic Wastewater Management Plan) prepared by the Shire was in 2007. It was developed across the whole municipality for high risk townships and did not include Lavers Hill.

Can Council supply a FULL costing of the most recent DWMP done in the Colac Otway shire? If not, why not? If so, when can I expect a copy of it to be delivered to me?

Response

Council received funding from the State Government of \$30,000, Council contributed \$15,000 and \$15,000 was contributed in-kind. The \$60,000 total funds were primarily used for the DWMP but also used for other plans as well.

3. What is the difference between an onsite waste water plan and a DWMP?

Response

An Onsite Waste Water Plan relates to management of waste water within the title boundary and can cover such factors as erosion. A DWMP generally looks at the bigger picture for township zones. It considers housing density, the size of land blocks and the ultimate disposal of effluent if the township is eventually sewered.

4. The answer to my question 2 at the 23 January, 2013 Council Meeting is that a DWMP is required to change zoning on the Lots (i) 19G\PP2089 and (ii) TP125018 pt 19G. Why is there no mention of the landowners of these 2 properties being responsible for costs involved in preparation of a DWMP? Why can my land not be included in this DWMP (on i and ii) when the impact on water quality will be much higher should this land be developed than one house on my property of 25 acres and, at the end of the day these two lots, regardless of what they are called, remain in the Water Catchment Area and are currently still zoned Farming?

Response

A Domestic Wastewater Management Plan is required to support a density of development greater than one dwelling per 40 hectares under the State Government Guidelines for Open Potable Water Supply Catchments. The land being rezoned to Township Zone north of the Great Ocean Road in Lavers Hill in Amendment C69 includes the Police Station and vacant land at 68-72 Great Ocean Road. Wannon Water, following extensive consultation in the preparation of the Rural Living Strategy and Amendment C69, supported these rezonings given one site was developed and the vacant lot could potentially be developed on the topmost section of the site without adverse impacts on water quality. No DWMP was considered necessary. Officers have scheduled a meeting with the water authorities and Ms Smith to explain the requirements of a DWMP and the process which would need to be undertaken.

5. I ask again what is the proposed Housing Density of the two lots detailed in Question 4 above and will subdivision be permitted on these 2 blocks?

Response

The density of dwellings in this location is above 1 per 40 hectares. A planning permit is required to further develop either of the allotments, including for a dwelling, under the Environmental Significance Overlay 3 which requires consideration of impacts on the water catchment. Referral of any application would be required to the water authority, which may or may not consent to the development proceeding following a detailed examination of potential water quality impacts. There is no guarantee of further development occurring on either of the two allotments.

6. Did Planning Officers at any time between the release of the Panel Report on C69 and January 19, 2013 contact the Panel Hearing Committee seeking clarification of any recommendations, specifically those relating to my property within the Panel Report and if not, why not? I ask this question as I was told by Doug McNeil at the 23 January, 2013 Council meeting that a lay person may misinterpret the recommendations as the document was badly written.

Response

Shire planning officers did not have any contact with Planning Panels Victoria to seek clarification of any of the recommendations of the C69 Panel report. This was not considered necessary given officers clearly understood the processes which needed to be followed in responding to the recommendations. Officers sought advice from planning staff at the Geelong office of the Department of Planning and Community Development (DPCD) prior to the 23 January 2013 Council meeting to confirm that it was following the correct process given the questions being raised by Ms Smith.

7. Does Council have any plans within the next ten years to acquire any land within the Lavers Hill area for any type of public use?

Response

There are currently no plans for acquisition of land by Council for public use within the next ten years.

8. Could someone please fully explain to me why my land cannot be included in Amendment C69 when 2-6 Frizon St, Forrest is to be rezoned TZ which was a zoning not supported in Report OM122507-6, Amendment 4, page 93, Submission 15? This land was exhibited to be rezoned RLZ, the submission requested that a TZ be applied, the Council Officer's comments did not support this rezoning, the Panel Recommendation was to rezone 2-6 Frizon St to TZ and it is now a change to exhibited Amendment. This shows that changes to exhibited amendments are possible so can Council explain the contradictory treatment between the land at Forrest and my own?

Response

It was not possible for rezoning of the Smith property to occur through Amendment C69. Because the property was not included in the exhibited amendment, it will need to go through a separate amendment process that allows surrounding land owners to respond with submissions through an exhibition process, and for formal input into the process by Wannon Water which is responsible for management of the water catchment. Such a rezoning would only be possible if justified/supported by a DWMP.

This is a long held consistent approach from DPCD which unfortunately was not made clear by the panel through its report. The land rezoned Township Zone at 2-6 Frizon Street was proposed to be rezoned Rural Living Zone by Amendment C69, and the Panel was able to consider the appropriateness of that zone during the panel process, and to make a recommendation for a different zoning without a separate amendment being required because it already formed part of the amendment and the change was not significant. Unlike the Smith property, a DWMP was not required to support the zoning change in Frizon Street as the land was not in a declared open potable water catchment.

<u>James Judd</u>

As last month no details were provided of what was bought up at a Council Workshop. When will you again provide these details to the public since the matter of the Library Annexe was moved from an open Council meeting to a Council Workshop. Without these details the public remains in the dark about the Council ever dealing with the matter. Unless someone leaks, no details ever get out and we want to know is it to continue and what hours will be provided.

Response

Councillor workshops and briefings are assemblies of Council and as such must be reported through our monthly meeting process. Almost invariably these briefings and workshops lead to disclosure through the regular Council meetings. The majority is in open Council with only those that meet the conditions of privacy, prejudicial situations or commercial in confidence matters being dealt with "in camera". Even then some of this material can be disclosed at a later date.

In checking the agenda for the January Council meeting, the agendas for the Councillors workshops on 12 December 2012 and the briefing session on 17 December 2012 were both included.

Is there a specific date of a briefing that you believe has not been disclosed?

2. The reduction proposed in the "Long Service Leave Reserve".

is this estimated using the present requirement rate of call on the Long Service Leave Reserve?

Has any account been taken for the actual amount falling due and payable at any given time?

Once due it is actually due and payable at call. You cannot base a calculation on the basis some would defer taking long service leave.

Funds must always be available to meet in full amounts due at any one time and this includes people who have worked long enough to accrue any long service leave entitlements. Be it in part or a full amount.

Response

After the transfer of funds from the Long Service Leave Reserve to fund part of the balance of the Defined Benefits Call, there will be a balance in the Reserve to meet any immediate payments due to staff.

Council has recognised the importance of retaining funds in the Reserve and has committed to paying back the Reserve in as short a time as practicable.

Phil & Marg Lawson

The Apollo Bay Structure Plan designates the area close to the commercial centre of Apollo Bay as "Higher density residential" and to "Encourage medium density residential" as far as McLachlan St.

However half the roads in these areas have no footpaths meaning mothers with small children and prams share the roadway with buses. This is clearly unsafe and unsatisfactory. Note: There are no footpaths on the majority of Nelson St [a major road from the harbour to the Shire Offices]. Half the length of Pascoe St has no footpath and no footpaths exist at all on Montrose Ave, Martin, Thompson and Murray Streets.

Is Council going to rectify this situation in the next few years? If not: When?

Response

Apollo Bay's footpath network has been previously appraised as part of the Apollo Bay Footpath Strategy. This document resulted in the definition of the primary footpath network and recommended work packages to complete this network. The primary footpath network is now in place. Regarding secondary footpath routes, such as Martin Street, Thompson and Murray Street, the Strategy recommended that construction proceed only where a Special Charge Scheme or other development contribution is secured.

The Council is currently undertaking a review of the Apollo Bay Footpath Strategy. This review will include full public consultation sessions prior to the Strategy being adopted by Council. I would encourage you to be part of this review process. Council welcomes and encourages public input and seeks to produce a Strategy that completely meets the needs of the broader Apollo Bay community. The information and consultation process will be advertised in the Colac Herald and Apollo Bay news sheet.

G. L. McKenzie

- 1. The Colac Otway Shire had a recent grant for a feasibility study of walk trails in the area that yielded answers with questionable monetary returns.
 - Does the Colac Otway Shire still employ the person that did the feasibility study? If so why?

Response

The Apollo Bay Trails Feasibility Study was carried out using a staff member on a one year fixed term contract. That person completed his project and has left Council's employ.

2. Are walk trails now a greater priority than the Apollo Bay rate payer's footpaths, curbing, underground drainage and even sealing the roads in Marengo and Skenes Creek? If so why?

Response

Walking trails are not necessarily a higher priority than footpaths, curbing or drainage nor are they more important than sealing roads.
