## Waste Tips:

- Place your food scraps in the **GREEN** organics bin.
- Keep your **RECYCLING** loose, don't bag it.
- Soft plastics go in the **RED** landfill bin, or recycle via supermarkets.

## Reasons your bin might not get collected:

### Contains incorrect material

- Eg. Household garbage in recycling or organics bin. **Bin was placed out after collection**

- Bins are required to be placed out the night before collection as per the Local Laws.
- Drivers have a strict schedule for collections and coming back for your bin may result in them not being able to finish the day's collections.

### Overfilled bins

- Bin should be no heavier than 80kg – if you have trouble moving it, trucks have trouble lifting it.
  - Cause spillage on the roadway.
  - Open bins attract birds and vermin.
  - Open bins become overweight due to water entry.
- Do not place extra items next to the bin as these cannot and will not be collected**
