G21 & AFL Barwon Towards 2030: Strategy



G21 - Geelong Region Alliance and AFL Barwon are seeking public feedback on the G21 and AFL Barwon Towards 2030: Strategy.

The strategy has been developed by local government authorities (LGAs) within the G21 region in partnership with AFL Barwon to guide planning and development of both football and netball over the next decade.

The key themes of the new Towards 2030: Strategy identify ways to increase diversity in participation, improve facilities and sustainability, build and retain football and netball participation and continue to support clubs and their people.

The strategy, in draft format, has been approved by all five G21 LGAs for public exhibition, and now community feedback is invited.

New signs promoting Geelong City Deal projects underway along the Colac Otway Shire coast will inform locals and visitors of the pending works and exciting developments.

The City Deal will deliver a redevelopment and major upgrade of the Apollo Bay Harbour precinct; a pathway linking Skenes Creek to Apollo Bay's Great Ocean Walk; and new toilets and visitor parking at Kennett River.

Colac Otway's three coastal projects demonstrate a significant investment across three years to support and diversify tourism growth, while boosting liveability in these much-loved Great Ocean Road towns. The projects are being funded for \$18.9 million by the Australian Government under the City Deal.

The Geelong City Deal is a 10-year plan to revitalise Geelong and unlock the potential of the Great Ocean Road visitor economy. The Australian and Victorian Governments, together with local Government, will deliver \$382.48 million in investment to the region, supporting the region's continued economic diversification and growth of the visitor economy.

Colac Otway Shire Council is working with community and business to bring the Apollo Bay, Skenes Creek and Kennett River projects to life.

These projects are currently in the Planning and Detailed Design phase, which includes the permit and approvals process, and project costings. Major on-site construction works will commence mid-2022.

Project director Frank Castles and the Geelong City Deal project team are based at Apollo Bay, and were joined by Colac Otway Shire Councillors for the recent project sign unveiling.
