News on Waste & Recycling

Apollo Bay and Alvie Transfer Station to operate 7 days a week

The Apollo Bay and Alvie Transfer Stations will be open seven days a week starting from Saturday 9 October.

Transfer Station hours of operation will be 10am to 2pm. Colac Otway Shire Council is pleased to offer this change in service to provide our community with additional options for disposing of recycling and waste.

Additional Green Waste Collection starts 18 October

Colac Otway Shire Council's additional green waste collection is about to start again to help you clean up your property and prepare for fire season - when your yellow bin goes out, put your green bin out too.

The additional green waste collection starts from 18 October (subject to your collection week) and continues through to the end of November.

Roll-out of the Purple Bin in Colac Otway

Colac Otway Shire Council will start delivering the new purple 'glass only' bins to properties that receive a kerbside waste collection in the shire.

Collection of the purple bin will start in November (when purple bins have been delivered to all properties).

What's staying the same?

- Your red bin (landfill) will continue to be collected weekly.
- Your yellow bin (for recycling) and green bin (for FOGO: Food Organics and Garden Organics) will continue to be collected fortnightly (don't forget, we're doing weekly green bin collections from late October through early November to help you clean up for fire season).



What's changing?

- When purple bin collections start in November, we'll ask you to 'be a good sort' and separate your glass recycling into the purple bin. You'll continue to use your yellow (recycling) bin for metal, paper, cardboard and hard plastics.
- Put your purple bin out (every four weeks) with your yellow

How will you know when the purple bin collection starts?

- Waste calendars with purple bin collection dates are included with your rates notice.
- You can look up waste calendars any time on Council's
