

10. What actions are you currently taking to manage the issues identified in section 9?

Council applied for an Authority to Control Wildlife license in August 2019 to manage the colony of flying-foxes in the Colac Botanic Gardens. A Grey-headed Flying-fox Management Plan was prepared by Council to ensure it met the Commonwealth's 'Referral guideline for management actions in grey-headed and spectacled flying-fox camps'. This Management Plan ensures that Council undertakes the best practice mitigation standards required of the referral guideline.

At the request of DELWP email correspondence was undertaken with the Department of Environment & Energy (DoEE) to confirm Council's approach conformed to the guideline requirements. The email correspondence, dated 25 July 2019 and 14 August 2019, has been provided previously. The email responses confirm Council's adherence to the guidelines in the provision of the Management Plan which is based on the NSW OEH camp management plan template as recommended in the referral guidelines. Council is of the view that these previous emails confirm Council's conformance to legislative and guideline requirements.

Following receipt of the ATCW license on 14 August 2019, Council proceeded with the planning and implementation of the dispersal strategy detailed in the CGHFFMP 6.2. The dispersal strategy was due to commence on 4 September 2019, however did not proceed due to the flying-foxes departing the site prior to the dispersal date. Council engaged Ecosure to provide the flying-fox expertise required in the dispersal strategy and Council continues to ensure that an appropriate assessment of the flying-foxes is undertaken prior to actions commencing and to inform DELWP prior to and throughout any implementation.

Council is cognisant of its obligations should the flying-foxes return to the Colac Botanic Gardens. This application is lodged on the basis that late pregnant or dependent young will not be in the Gardens at the time of implementing the action outlined in this ATCW and seeks a license to undertake the proposed dispersal strategy as outlined in the Management Plan.



11. What activities are you proposing to undertake to manage the wildlife problem?

For example: scaring, shooting, trapping and shooting, trapping and release, destroying eggs and nests.

The CGHFFMP provides a detailed dispersal strategy that Council seeks to implement in the Colac Botanic Gardens. As part of the CGHFFMP, Council is undertaking a planting program to provide alternative camp habitats in the Colac region. The locations include Deanes Creek, Patsch Nature Reserve, Wetlands Track & Delaney's Rd, Baltinore, this is intended to be an ongoing planting program.

The dispersal strategy, over seen by a flying-fox expert, seeks the dispersal of the flying-foxes from the Gardens utilising measures of audio and visual actions each morning as a deterrent to the flying-foxes returning and smoke subject to the success of the pre mentioned actions. Council has also submitted a grant application for installation of tree canopy mounted sprinklers separate to this ATCW.

Whilst the future roosting locations are identified in the CGHFFMP it is acknowledged that the flying foxes may roost at other locations. Council considers the following to be unsuitable locations and further dispersal will be undertaken should GHFFs roost at:

Barongarook Creek Precinct (except Joseph Paatsch Reserve); Colac Memorial Square; Colac Racecourse; Educational facilities; Queens Ave Colac Lake Foreshore; Child Care Centres

Council is committed in ensuring that the best practice mitigation standard contained within the Management Plan are adhered to, in conjunction with any additional license conditions. Further community engagement and communication is being prepared to be disseminated through Council's communication channels to the Colac community.
