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# Geelong City Deal projects in Colac Otway Shire

The <u>Geelong City Deal</u> is delivering three major infrastructure projects funded by the Australian Government along the Colac Otway Shire coastline at Apollo Bay, Kennett River and Skenes Creek.

The City Deal is a 10-year plan to revitalise Geelong and unlock the potential of the Great Ocean Road economy. The Australian and Victorian governments, together with local government, will deliver \$500 million of investment under the City Deal, supporting the region's continued economic diversification and growth of the visitor economy.

## **Apollo Bay Harbour Redevelopment**



A new 30,000 litre diesel fuel tank has arrived at the Port of Apollo Bay. The new tank allows for Mother's Beach car park improvements to be made at the Harbour.

The tank sits on the wharf, next to the refuelling station, and will be used by Apollo Bay's fishermen to refuel their vessels.

Jointly funded by the Apollo Bay Fishermen's Co-op who will own the tank and new wharf-side bowser cabinet, and the Geelong City Deal funded Apollo Bay Harbour Redevelopment project who have paid for the relocation as part of the improvements to the Harbour, the new fuel tank will be a great new asset for Harbour users.
