Contract 2102 Apollo Bay to Skenes Creek Coastal Trail - Planning and **Design Services**

Colac Otway Shire Council has awarded a contract for the planning and detailed design for a new coastal trail between Apollo Bay and Skenes Creek, funded under the Geelong City Deal.

The 2.84-kilometre shared-use path was a project initiated by the local community and supported by Colac Otway Shire, Apollo Bay Chamber of Commerce and State Government authorities.

Colac Otway Endorses Important Community Infrastructure Projects

Colac Otway Shire Council voted at last week's meeting on a priority project list which details eight projects across the shire which will be fully funded through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

The list has been developed following consideration of requests made by the community in the recent 2021- 22 budget consultation and in previous years. The projects identified, once implemented, will bring a number of economic and social benefits to the Colac Otway community. Preference will be given to use of local materials and contractors through the procurement process to ensure maximum value is returned to the local economy.

- Bass Crescent, Great Ocean Road, stormwater outlet upgrade Skenes Creek \$500,000
- Great Ocean Road Footpath, Stage 1 Apollo Bay \$300,000
- Great Ocean Road Footpath, Stage 2 Apollo Bay \$150,000
- Rail Interface Upgrade Birregurra \$175,000
- Barongarook Creek Shared Path Colac \$390,000
- Old Beechy Rail Trail upgrade Gellibrand to Beech Forest \$58,000
- Warrion Hall upgrade Warrion \$70,000
- · Clark Street Footpath Colac \$60,000.

The list will be submitted for approval to the Federal Government in Round 2 of the LRCI Program, with projects to start as soon as possible and completed by the end of December 2021. Round 2 of LRCI funding is in addition to \$1.703-million received under Round 1 of the LRCI Program which is funding 13 local projects currently under construction across the shire.
