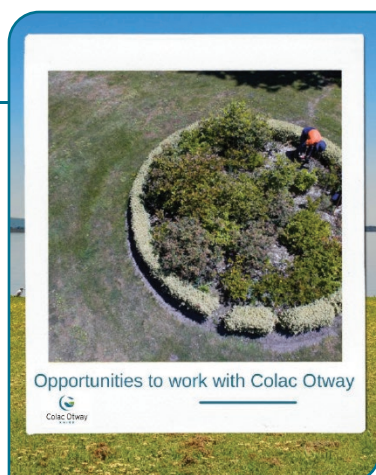

Have Your Say

Council has identified the Elliminyt Wetlands Project as a key infrastructure investment needed to facilitate residential land provision in the Elliminyt area.

The project outcomes will manage, control and improve the quality of storm water in the Elliminyt catchment.

The site is located on Irrewillipe Road between Hart, Ballagh and Armstrong streets. The grant will enable Council to make improvements to the functionality of the existing basin and create new wetlands. This will also help to unlock about 70 hectares of residential land for future development immediately upstream of the basin.

Community members are invited to provide feedback on the Elliminyt Wetlands Project and draft concept design via an online feedback form - visit Council's website and search 'Elliminyt Wetlands'.

Hard copies of the survey are also available at Council's Customer Service Centres in Colac (2-6 Rae Street) and Apollo Bay (GORVIC - 100 Great Ocean Road).

Council has received grant monies of \$3 million from the Victorian Government from the Regional Infrastructure Fund and \$1.2 million from the Federal Government Local Road and Community Infrastructure Fund to upgrade the existing storm water retarding basin.
