### Snake Safety

There have been several snake sightings in eady, including the playground

Be on the look out when you're out and about in the region.

### If you live in an area with snakes:

- Clear your yard and keep your grass cut low to deter snakes
- Keep your first aid kit stocked with compression bandages
- If you see a snake, calmly leave the area with your pets and children
- Call Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action on 136 186 for advice on snake controllers in your area. If someone is bitten, call 000 immediately.

Snakes are protected under the Wildlife Act 1975 and it is illegal to harm or capture them without authority.
