Wye River and Kennett River communities will see green waste skips once again placed in town from Friday 3 November to Monday 27 November 2023 to assist with property clean-up.

Bark Collection in Wye and Kennett River and Separation Creek

To help our coastal communities prepare for fire season, Wye, Kennett and Separation Creek will receive a free bark and leaf collection again this year. Wye and Kennett River and Separation Creek residents - please start having bark and leaf piles ready for collection. Collections will take

- Wye River and Separation Creek on Monday 13 until Wednesday 15 November.
- Kennett River Thursday 16 and Friday 17 November.

The collection is for bark and leaves only, not tree branches. If you have larger tree branches, please place them directly in the green waste skips.
