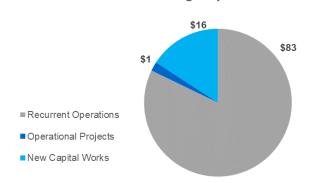

- \$17 will be committed to new initiatives (capital and operational projects)

#### How does \$100 get spent in 2023-24?

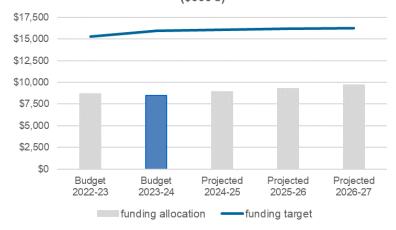


#### **Asset Renewal Funding**

This highlights a funding gap that needs to be funded through rates revenue.

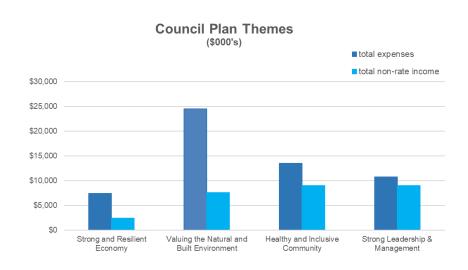
## Annual Asset Renewal Funding Allocation (\$000's)
