4. MAYORAL STATEMENT

5. QUESTION TIME

The following is a correction to the response given to a question submitted in writing by Damien Dureau at the May Council Meeting:

Question 3.

Colac Otway Shire Council has previously indicated to me that it will disclose the names of members, and the organizations they represent, on any Committee associated with the Global Connector facility, as requested. (Refer COSC Ordinary Meeting Minutes 25 November 2009, page 4). Please advise of the total number, the individual's names, and the organizations they represent, of the current members of the newly formed "Beechy Precinct Community Consultative Group", referred to in The Beechy Precinct Newsletter, April 2010, page 3?

Response

The Beechy Precinct Community Consultative Committee includes representatives from a number of organisations and other individuals who have expressed interest in being involved.

The organisations represented include:

- DPCD
- DEECD
- Colac Otway Shire
- Colac Secondary College Teachers & Students
- Youth Council
- Corangamite Regional Library Corporation
- U3A
- Colac Toy Library
- Otway Community College
- Neighbourhood Renewal/Community Hub
- Colac Woodturners & Woodcrafters Guild
- OBI

There is no fixed number as to who is on the committee. The numbers vary as to who can attend on the day the meetings are held.

Questions Received Verbally at the Meeting

Victoria Moore – Gerangamete

Why did the Council consider it not necessary to engage in community consultation with the citizens of Forrest in regard to the Optus 45 metre telecommunications tower which is being erected in the centre of town?

Why has there been no consultative process undertaken with regard to the installation of a Telstra tower of the same ilk in Yaugher?

Why did Council decide to treat this as nothing more than the erection of a house therefore only having to abide by the minimalist legal requirements of a notice on a site which has been derelict for a number of years and attracts very little attention and one public notice in the Colac Herald which many of the Forrest residents did not have the opportunity to read therefore only affording them two weeks in order to respond in a respectful manner to the Shire in regard to this tower?

Response:

The Acting General Manager for Sustainable Planning & Development advised that Council had followed the notice requirements under the *Planning & Environment Act 1987* with respect to the installation of the Optus tower at 6 Blundy Street, Forrest. A sign had been erected on the site, a public notice had been placed in the Colac Herald and adjoining and opposite properties had been advised. A more extensive amount of public notice had been applied to the application than that given to a normal house extension or a new house. The general public was made aware of the application and any submissions were considered at the time.

With respect to the installation of the Telstra tower, the application for a permit is still going through the normal public notice process.

Why did Council not consider putting in place a community consultation process with Forrest community members considering that in some states of America these towers are considered illegal if they have been installed within 400 meters of schools because of health concerns resulting from the microwaves they emit and that this tower is being built within 400 metres of the Forrest Primary School?

Response:

The Acting General Manager for Sustainable Planning & Development advised that there are no minimum buffer zones required in the state of Victoria with regard to minimum distance between a dwelling and a mobile phone tower. However there is a code of practice which gives guidance to the construction of these towers and it is his understanding that this proposal complies with the current code of practice. Council did not consider it necessary to go beyond the public notice requirements of the Act.

Is it true that the reason that this particular site was chosen was because Council owns the land and Optus will pay Council rental for the property and that there were various other sites available?

Response

The CEO responded that the site was selected by Optus after tests undertaken throughout the area revealed that it was the best site.

Lyn Foster – FOCL

When 90% of library users visit the library to borrow books, what benefits will the joint use library provide to the community when the only gain to users will be a larger space built for school space apart from additional travel to get less than what we already have?

Response

The CEO responded that the joint use library will provide more benefits to the community than a standard conventional library, it is a contemporary space where users, in particular the disadvantaged members of our community, can access additional facilities which include: greater access to digital data opportunities; access to a proposed Homework Club; and lecture and meeting room facilities.

Is the CEO a current member and regular user of the Colac Library?

Response

The CEO advised that he is a regular user of research material and a current member of the Colac Library.

Why doesn't the new joint use library have at least the required 34000 public library books per capita base but in reality will only have 25000 books, 4,000 less than the current understocked public library has? How can we rely on corporate sponsorship to provide more books, when you are about to slash the CRLC marketing budget from \$30,000 to \$5,000?

Response

The General Manager for Corporate & Community Services advised that there would be 50,000 – 60,000 books in the facility. Changes to the CRLC marketing budget would need to be discussed with the new CEO as part of the overall marketing strategy for the CRLC.

The CEO also noted that there will be more books and space available and that Council will explore opportunities to improve the library service including greater access to digital service.

Paul David Cross – Colac

Does the Mayor realise the absolute irony of her complaining publicly recently in the Colac Herald about government cost shifting when the biggest and most disastrous cost shifting exercise in the history of the Colac Otway Shire only occurred because she voted to proceed with the Colac Joint Use School Library?

Response

The Mayor replied that she voted as she saw fit for the benefit of the Colac Otway community.

Does the Mayor stand by what she said in her comments on the You Tube with respect to the Joint Use Library?

Response

The Mayor stated that her preferred site for the library had been the existing site however she had voted as a Councillor for what was best for the community and voted for the joint use library in the best interests of the whole community. Did you vote for the joint use library because of the threat of funding cuts?

Response

The Mayor stated that no she did not, she had voted for what was best for the whole community.

Do you still agree that if joint use library fails that it will be considered a white elephant?

Response

The Mayor responded that that was his statement and that she, the Councillors and the community are working hard to ensure the success of the joint use library and that no, the joint use library would not be considered a white elephant.

Victoria Moore – Gerangamete

Why didn't the Council consider it necessary to undertake an extensive public consultation process with respect to this tower given the importance of this issue and the wording in the Opening Prayer?

Response

The CEO advised that the community consultation standards which applied in this matter had been followed. The issues mentioned earlier with respect to the electro-magnetic fields have not been proven in the state of Victoria.

Dieter Wessner – FOCL

With reference to page 12 of the CEO's Progress Report to Council, why, as a member of the Friends of the Colac Library user group was I and other members of the group not consulted with respect to the Joint Use Library Opening Event?

Response

The CEO advised that the process had included consultation with the major stakeholders involved in bringing the joint use library together including the Dept of Planning & Community Development, the Dept of Education and Early Childhood Development, the Colac Otway Shire and the Colac Secondary College.

The CEO also noted that the Friends of Colac Library (FOCL) and the Colac Otway Shire have the similar objective in providing the best library service to the community. Given this, the CEO has invited members of FOCL to meet on a number of occasions to discuss these issues with him and while this invitation had not yet been accepted, it remains on the table.

Victoria Moore – Gerangamete

Does Council think it has exercised its duty of care in regard to community consultation with respect to the Optus tower in Forrest?

Response

The CEO advised that the community consultation process had been undertaken in accordance with usual procedures.

Mr James Judd – Colac

I received a letter of acknowledgement today with a squiggle but no name. Will Council ensure that signed off letters contain the name of the person sending the letter or the name under the sign off of the name of the person they represent?

Response:

The letter of acknowledgement is an automatically generated response letter from Document Management Services that can be signed by any member of the unit.

The letter of acknowledgement indicates who will respond to the particular issue.

It is Council's practice that response letters indicate the name and title of the person answering the letter.

<u> Damien Dureau – Colac</u>

Would you please provide me with answers in writing to the following questions:-

- 1. There were 2 Committees associated with Library Services in Colac Otway Shire, pre-Joint Use School Library
 - (i) (1) The Council of Colac Otway Shire Council; (2) The Board of Corangamite Regional Library Corporation). Now, there are at least 9 Committees associated with Library Services in Colac Otway Shire
 - (ii) (1) Beechy Precinct Project Management Group; (2) Beechy Precinct Communications Reference Group; (3) Beechy Precinct Community Consultative Group; (4) Colac Secondary College School Council/Board; (5) The Council of Colac Otway Shire Council; (6) The Board of Corangamite Regional Library Corporation; (7) Joint Committee; (8) Global Connector Operations Reference Group; (9) "Enhanced Delivery of Library Services in Colac" project's un-named specific purpose Project Working Group Committee.
 - (a) Please advise if there are any other Committees associated with Library Services in Colac Otway Shire; and if so, how many other such Committees are there, and what are the names of those Committees?

Response:

There are no other Committees associated with Library Services in Colac Otway Shire. The committee that was formed for the Enhanced Delivery of Library Services Project is no longer operational.

(b) I believe that in the Colac Otway Shire Organization Structure Chart that Library Services came under the direct responsibility of the Manager Recreation, Arts & Culture, but a change has occurred and Library Services now comes under the direct responsibility of the General Manager Corporate & Community Services(Refer COSC Ordinary Meeting Agenda 26 May 2010, pages 61 and 62).

Please advise has there been such a change; and does Library Services come under the direct responsibility of the General Manager Corporate & Community Services and not the Manager Recreation, Arts & Culture in Colac Otway Shire's Organization Structure Chart?

Response:

Library services has always come under the direct responsibility of the General Manager Corporate & Community Services.

(c) Colac Otway Shire's General Manager Corporate & Community Services represents Colac Otway Shire Council on the following Committees listed at 1(ii) above, as per the last updates of members of these Committees: - (1), (2), (6), (7), (9); and possibly (3) (as awaiting the total number, the individual's names, and the organizations they represent, of the current members of that Committee to be provided at the start of the 23 June 2010 Council Meeting, and recorded in the Council Minutes, as a correction to the answer of my question 3 asked at the 26 May 2010 Council Meeting).

Cr Stephen Hart represents Colac Otway Shire Council on the following Committees listed at 1(ii) above, as per the last updates of members of these Committees: - (5), (6) and (7). Colac Otway Shire's Manager Recreation, Arts & Culture represents Colac Otway Shire Council on the following Committees listed at 1(ii) above, as per the last updates of members of these Committees: - (1), (2), (8), (9); and possibly (3).

With the resignation of Colac Otway Shire's Manager Recreation, Arts & Culture, who will be appointed as the replacement to represent Colac Otway Shire Council on each of the Committees (1), (2), (8), (9); as well as (3) (if applicable), listed at 1(ii) above, ie. will it be Cr Stephen Hart; the new Manager Recreation, Arts & Culture; or someone else, and if so, who?

Response:

Where required the new Manager Recreation, Arts & Culture will continue to be on the various committees. The Beechy Precinct covers far more than just the Library.

2.1 (a) Have the "Parties" to the Agreement (that is, The Minister for Education, Colac Secondary College School Council/Board, and Colac Otway Shire Council) yet "agreed" on the "contents" of Annexure D, "Description of the role and functions of the Joint Committee", and "incorporated" it into the "Agreement"?

Response:

Not yet finalised. Will be incorporated into the Agreement when finalised.

(b) Would Colac Otway Shire Council please now give an undertaking that when the contents of Annexure D is agreed upon between the Parties, and incorporated into the Agreement, it will be posted up on the Colac Otway Shire's website, under the existing "Beechy Precinct" prompt/field (either as a separate document; or preferably with the entire Agreement as it is not yet posted up there) (and preferably as an item listed on the relevant month's Council Meeting Agenda, as well) ?

Response: Will be part of the Agreement.

2.2 (a) Has a "Library Operator" formally being appointed to operate the Library/Resource Area at the Global Connector; and if so, is that Library Operator the Corangamite Regional Library Corporation?

Response:

The Library Operator will be the Corangamite Regional Library Corporation.

(b) Would Colac Otway Shire Council please now give an undertaking that if a "Library Operator" is appointed to operate the Library/Resource Area at the Global Connector, the "separate agreement", when it is developed between Colac Secondary College School Council/Board, Colac Otway Shire Council and the Library Operator, will be posted up on the Colac Otway Shire's website, under the existing "Beechy Precinct" prompt/field (and preferably as an item listed on the relevant month's Council Meeting Agenda, as well) ?

Response: To be determined.

3. (a) COSC advised at the 26 May 2010 Council Meeting that the total fit-out costs to the interior of the Global Connector "will not cost an estimated \$500,000". Therefore, what will be the approximate amount of the total fit-out costs to the interior of the Global Connector?

Response:

The costs for the fit-out are still being worked on between the various parties.

(b) COSC advised at the 26 May 2010 Council Meeting that in the COSC letter handed to Professor Dawkins on 25 February 2010, "Council was seeking funds towards the fit-out". Please confirm that COSC was seeking funds towards only COSC's contribution (ie. excluding DEECD-Colac Secondary College's contribution) to the fit-out costs to the interior of the Global Connector; approximately what amount was COSC seeking in "further government funding" towards COSC's contribution to the fit-out costs to the interior of the Global Connector; and has COSC received a response from the Victorian State Government to that request, and if so, what was the State Government's response, and when was it received?

Response:

As indicated in May, Council was seeking funds towards the fit-out of the facility. As also indicated previously in May, DEECD advised that they have provided funds to the College for fit out costs of the total College project.

(c) What will be the approximate amount that COSC will provide to the fit-out costs to the interior of the Global Connector from its own direct funds (ie. excluding any government grants to COSC's contribution; and excluding DEECD-Colac Secondary College's contribution); and will payment of this amount still mean that COSC's total contribution to the construction of the Global Connector will not exceed its estimated maximum payment of \$1.3 million?

Response:

The costs for the fit-out are still being worked on between the various parties. All fit-out costs will be done in line with the Shire's total contribution of \$1.3m.

- 4. How many of each of the following will be provided at the Colac Joint Use School Library:-
 - (a) Distinct dedicated "Public Internet Access PCs"?

Response:

Will be a minimum of 4 "Public Internet Access PCs". Further PC's to be assessed. Will be other shared computer areas within the facility.

(b) Distinct dedicated "Public Computer Printers"?

Response:

Will be a minimum of 1 "Public Computer Printer". Further printers to be assessed. Will be other shared computer areas within the facility.

(c) Distinct dedicated "Public Self-Service Photocopiers"?

Response:

Will be 1 dedicated "Public Self-Service Photocopier".

(d) Distinct dedicated "Colac Secondary College School community (ie. Colac Secondary College School staff and students) only Internet Access PCs"?

Response:

Not applicable.

(e) Distinct dedicated "Colac Secondary College School community (ie. Colac Secondary College School staff and students) only Computer Printers"?

Response: Not applicable.
